School Uniform

Wearing uniform is obligatory; all students must comply with the school's uniform code.

Not only does the uniform and smartness of our students add to the school's image and prestige in the wider community, but it also contributes significantly to a professional and focused atmosphere within school, that we know is conducive to achievement.

A high standard of appearance is required at all times and is integral to creating our positive ethos and sense of belonging.

Our uniform was launched in September 2022. The uniform and logo has been designed to represent both the rich heritage of the school and that of the wider community.

Not Permitted

Students are permitted to wear one watch and one pair of stud earrings.

Mobile phones are not permitted in school and will be confiscated if seen.

The following are not permitted in school: denim jackets, hoodies, caps, designer clothing, body piercings, extreme hairstyles or colours, excessive make-up, or the wearing of trainers other than in PE lessons.



Student Uniform Requirements

Daily Uniform

- Filey School black blazer with school badge to be worn at all times in school.
- Optional black school v-neck jumper.
- Plain white shirt (long or short sleeved).
- Filey School tie.
- Plain black school straight leg trousers.
 These must not be tight fitting.

Or...

- Filey School green skirt with academy logo or plain black trousers, straight legged, slightly flared or boot cut.
 Jeans, skin-tight trousers and leggings are not permitted.
- Black socks or black tights
- Plain black sensible school shoes (not boots, trainers, suede or canvas pumps or sandals).

School Shoes ACCEPTABLE Black polishable school shoes only:

PE Kit

Compulsory PE Kit

All students must wear the school PE kit, available from 'Rumours'. Boys should wear the Filey School shorts and polo shirts. Girls must wear the Filey School polo shirt and either Filey School shorts or plain black leggings

Optional PE Kit

- Football boots and shin pads
- Filey School fleece
- Filey School rugby shirt
- Plain black tracksuit bottoms or leggings
- Plain black under skin
- Plain black beanie hat and gloves



Further Information

In addition to the information above, we do not allow the wearing of hoodies at any time during the school day. Uniform can be purchased from 'Rumours' in Scarborough. Should your child come to school in clothing not listed above they will be given school uniform to wear from the supplies we hold in school. They will also be issued with a detention. If you have any concerns regarding uniform, your Head of Year, Miss Colling, will be able to help.



What does my child need?

At Filey School, your child will have to walk from one lesson to the next. They will therefore need to carry all of their books and items with them for each lesson. A robust bag or rucksack will be required. Lockers are however available to store books, PE kit etc, at a cost of £5 deposit. This will be returned at the end of the year when the key is returned to reception.

It would be useful for your child to get in to the habit of packing their bag the night before with all the things they will need for the next day. On the first day of school your child will be issued with their timetable, which will be copied into their planner to help with organisation.

Student Planner

On your child's first day at Filey School, they will be issued with a planner. This should be carried with them from lesson to lesson and placed, open to today's date, on their desk at the start of the lesson.

It should be used for:

- Writing down important information
- Recording homework and the due date for handing it in
- Absence notes for your child's tutor
- Keeping important school papers and letters safe on their way home.

Your child's form tutor will check and sign the planner each week. Please do check your child's planner every night for important communications.







At Filey School, we believe that learning independently, planning and organising time outside the classroom are important skills to develop from the outset.

The school encourages the setting of homework, with homework set by different subjects during the week with clear deadlines. Students will be given sufficient time to complete homework. All homework and deadlines will be recorded in the student planner.

The time devoted to homework should increase as the student progresses through the school. In years 7, 8 and 9 you should spend at least 30 minutes on each subject, each week. In years 10 and 11 this should increase. The focus of homework will also change as students progress towards external exams.

Did you know your choice of calculator can help you to make better progress in Maths? We recommend that all students should invest in the 'Casio CLASSWIZ - fx-83GTX (pictured below).

Assemblies

Assemblies are an important element of the school week. They provide a valuable opportunity for year groups to meet together. As a result, we offer a wide and exciting range of clubs both within the school lunch time and as part of an extensive offer of after school clubs, ranging from a multitude of sporting opportunities to ICT Coding Club, school productions, JASS Award and the very popular Duke of Edinburgh Award Scheme. The school offers external support for the tuition of students wishing to learn a musical instrument.

Information about the clubs we offer will be given to your child throughout the year. Details of the clubs will also be available on the school website and social media feeds.

School Ambassadors

The 'School Ambassadors' are a group of current Year 7, 8 and 9 students who have successfully applied for the privilege to support your child in their transition to Filey School, in addition to a range of other activities throughout the year.

The 'School Ambassadors' are easily identifiable by their green badges worn on their blazers. They support your child's smooth transition to their new school, by conducting school tours, answering your questions and by being 'on hand' when you start your new school with us.

Attendance and Punctuality

If your child is to gain the benefit of a good education and maximise their potential they need to attend school every day. Holidays are not authorised in school time as we recognise that if your child misses timetabled lessons they will fall behind their peers and are less likely to reach their full potential.

We also expect that students arrive to school every day on time and that they arrive punctually to lessons throughout the school day. Late arrival at school or lessons will result in a detention

Safety

Please ensure that your child leaves all valuables at home.

Mobile phones and EarPods are not allowed to be used in school. If they are seen to be being used they will be confiscated by a member of staff and kept securely in the school office until such time that a parent / carer can come to school to pick the item(s) up. This system also applies to inappropriate jewellery that is not part of the school uniform allowed items









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
