The UK Youth Parliament is a youth organisation in the United Kingdom, consisting of democratically elected members aged between 11 and 18.

Formed in 2000, the parliament has 369 members, who are elected to represent the views of young people in their area to government and service providers.

The UK Youth Parliament is run by the British Youth Council. Anyone aged between 11-18 can apply to be a candidate for election, and this takes place across the whole of the UK. It is the only national vote an under 18 can be part of

I am very grateful to have had a great coach and support team behind me. I worked really hard every single day to make sure I performed to my best ability and it certainly paid off.






Safeguarding – Tips and Information

Safeguarding

We are fully committed to ensuring that consistent, effective safeguarding procedures are in place to support families, students and staff at school. Within school, Mrs Emmerson and Mrs Pickering lead the safeguarding and pastoral support alongside the Heads of Year and Form Tutors to offer guidance when needed to all of our students and their parents/carers where appropriate. We have developed our relationships with the various external agencies to provide additional guidance and support – including
